


An Introduction from Mrs Green

Hello, my name is Claire Green and I would like to introduce myself as the new teacher of Blaise class, as of January 2021; a role I am incredibly excited about undertaking. Having had the opportunity to work in St Cuby class during the Autumn Term I have been hugely impressed by the welcoming and nurturing atmosphere shared among staff and children and how this has had a positive impact on each child's ability to achieve their potential. I believe I share the vision and values of Ladock C of E School and will be able to support each child to blossom.

I grew up in Cornwall and attended schools in Newquay before leaving to follow my passion in music and study at Trinity College of Music, London. It was a fantastic opportunity to experience the bustling and dynamic city life and take advantage of the many cultural opportunities that London had to offer a young, enthusiastic music student, however, the call of the rugged sea, open space and family ties eventually brought me home. Since returning to Cornwall I have enjoyed over 13 years of teaching and welcomed two of my own beautiful children: Noah, 7, and Lilian, 5. My children now happily consume my free time and I cherish every adventure we share in this wonderful county.

My interest in teaching began during a voluntary placement at The Roundhouse, London, acting as a Creative Projects Community Coordinator Assistant working with children in pupil referral units, young victim support groups and local north London secondary schools. It was during my time there that I was able to see how young people of varied backgrounds could develop confidence, self-esteem, and transferable skills through their involvement in arts projects. This experience inspired my own teaching career and has shaped my ethos as a teacher: to create an inclusive, creative learning environment that promotes positive achievement for all.

After graduating from Trinity College of Music I trained as a secondary music teacher through Cornwall SCITT. At the end of my teacher training I was one of six students to receive an award for outstanding teaching practice. I completed my NQT year at Wadebridge School where I took on a range of responsibilities beyond what would be expected of an NQT. However, a continuing desire to become a primary teacher led me to apply for and take on the position of HLTA at Indian Queens School, providing PPA cover for Reception and KS1 and 1:1 support for a Y2 child, this led to a position within the school as a temporary Y3/4 class teacher covering adoption leave.

Since this role I have successfully worked for over ten years as a primary teacher in Cornish schools. Most recently I worked at Sandy Hill Academy, St Austell. As an outstanding school this was a fantastic opportunity to further my professional development and help to drive the schools vision and shape the lives of some of their pupils. As a teacher I feel very privileged to have taught in Early Years and across all four Key Stages, preparing children for phonics screening, SATs, GCSEs and A 'levels. This has provided an insight into the learning journey children go on and will enable me to prepare your child for their transition from Ladock to their secondary school as I understand the demands they will face but equally all the wonderful and exciting opportunities that lie ahead of them.

As a teacher I have developed excellent relations with the children in the classes through continual reinforcement of high expectations and a creative curriculum. I have experience of teaching a high number or SEN (Special educational Needs) children with a vast range of needs, from ASD to dyslexia, whom I have been able to successfully support through the provision of differentiated tasks, use of IEPs (Individual Education Plans) and Behaviour Plans and by working in partnership with the SENCO, TAs and parents. I work closely with colleagues and parents and carers to ensure children are appropriately supported and to enhance the curriculum delivered to them. During my first maternity leave I was keen to continue my professional development so began a Masters in Education degree. I completed modules on SEN and carried out a number of small research projects, including the benefit of peer work for Y5 and Y6 children and the transition from Early Years to Key Stage 1. Completing my MEd degree has helped me to consider in greater depth my role as a teacher and how I support children's learning and mediate their understanding of the curriculum delivered.

My passion for learning grew from my own experiences in primary and secondary school. As a teacher at Ladock C of E School I will return the enthusiasm, passion and commitment to your child and provide a wealth of learning opportunities so your child may continue to develop as a creative, confident and happy individual.

In these unprecedented times I understand that a change of teachers during an academic year may be a concern to you and that, at present, it is difficult to have the contact I would like to have with you. Therefore I would welcome the opportunity to speak with you further on how I will support and nurture your child's academic development and emotional well-being as their teacher. An opportunity for a phone consultation will be available from 11th January, when I will have had some time to get to know the class and the needs of your child in greater depth. However, if you feel the need to speak with me sooner then please get in touch with the school so a phone consultation can be organised at an earlier date.

In the meantime, have a wonderful Christmas and I look forward to meeting

you in the Spring Term.


