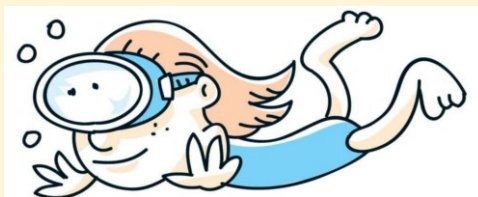

I Have a Dream!



Planning our production of I Have a Dream!



We started our topic this term with a poem with a rhythmic verse, which told the story of civil rights struggle, with simplicity and power from the book, *This is the Dream* by Diane Z Shore and Jessica Alexander.



It told about the USA founded on the declaration that all men were created equal – but some two hundred years later it was still deeply segregated.

Slowly but surely, powerful leaders as well as everyday citizens spoke up for their dreams and beliefs and soon, a people proud and strong stood up as one for their rights. St Ladoca class then looked at four such people;

Mary Seacole, a Victorian lady who travelled, ran a business, and nursed the sick and wounded in the Crimean, even though people didn't always treat her with the respect and compassion that she showed to others.

Walter Tull, a young man who had so much sadness in his young life, but he had a skill of playing football, and followed his dream. Even though opposing fans were cruel, he continued to play and then went to serve his country in WW1, where he showed great courage and strength during battle, caring for the men in his battalion, risking his own life to save them, becoming an officer and paying that ultimate sacrifice of dying in battle, with the belief that it was the right thing to do.

Rosa Parks, a young women, who had a thirst for education. She loved school, but was also very loyal and committed to her family. She also believed and dreamed of equality. She stood up for her beliefs and found the strengths to say the law of segregation was wrong!

Martin Luther-King, a Pastor, who helped Rosa and fought alongside many black and mixed-heritage people in the 1960's to create a free America, where people are not judged by the colour of their skin.

Mrs Milling weaved all this learning and the children's own dreams into a short play for the children to perform, and with Mrs Argent directing, the premier of I Have A Dream was performed on Friday 13th July to parents, guardians, family and friends in the Community Hall.

Our production was supported by Big Ideas and the Remember Together project which is funded by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) with an additional National Lottery grant from the Big Lottery Fund.

TULL100 – Football Remembers is a community engagement programme commemorating the life of Walter Tull and encourages participating groups to make their communities more inclusive.
