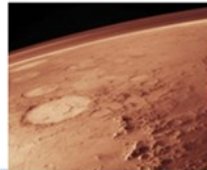

The war on plastics is heightening all around us. In December last year Walkers joined with a company called Terracycle and launched a scheme to recycle crisp packets. Since then over 11 million packets have been recycled and more and more companies are signing up to these recycling schemes, reducing the amount of waste ending up in landfill and our beautiful seas. At school we are joining the #waronplastic working with Terracycle to recycle all brands of crisp packets, biscuit & cake wrappers and chocolate & sweet wrappers!
