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

#### Statement from the Diocese of Truro

The directors of Celtic Cross Education have for several years been considering how to replace the temporary buildings at Ladock C of E Primary School and develop the site in the best interests of the pupils.

Exploratory conversations between the Education Department and Glebe Management Committee of the Diocese of Truro, and Celtic Cross Education are ongoing as they work together to see what might be possible and affordable.

If School House is to be included in any plan, alternative housing would be provided for the current tenant.

Once a feasible project is conceived, the plan would be for a public consultation to ensure all interested parties have the opportunity to express a view. This would be before any planning application is made.
