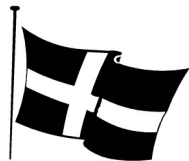

Parent Consultation Evenings 23rd & 24th March 2020

Parent Consultation Evenings will take place on Monday 23rd and Tuesday 24th March 3.30–6.30pm (6.20 last appointment).

Appointments can be made to meet with your child(ren)'s teacher via the Parents evening system (see below). If you are unable to make any of these dates, please let your child's class teacher know and we will try to arrange an alternative appointment.

You will be presented with a log-in screen where you will need to enter your name, your email address (if you enter your email address, you will receive an email confirmation of your booking) and your child's name and DOB. You can then log on and continue with your booking(s). You can choose your child's class/teacher, and either day 1 or 2. It is very straight forward, but if you do have a problem, or do not have access to the internet, please speak to Jane, who can make the booking(s) for you.

Please note that appointments are limited to 10 minute slots.

CCE Initial Teacher Training – now open for applications!

As a Trust we have planned our own ITT programme with Plymouth Marjon University, offering a PGCE with QTS training course. The course is a 'School Direct' course where training takes place both at Marjon, but mainly within schools – learning 'on the job'.



The Primary (5-11) course aims to give participants experience of the full range of ages between 5 and 11 in two contrasting school placements – probably one large urban and one smaller rural. Trainees initially observe and work with small groups, eventually leading to whole class teaching in two different schools. Trainees also benefit from taking part in three focus weeks based on SEND, Outdoor Education and Christian Distinctiveness. Taught sessions will take place once or twice a week at Plymouth Marjon University where trainees will essentially be taught the academic requirements of the PGCE course. Other training sessions will be offered by the Trust.

Applications can be accepted by UCAS now as the course is now 'live' on their site.

10 facts for St Piran's Day

1. Saint Piran is the patron saint of tin-miners and is generally regarded as the national saint of Cornwall.
2. Saint Piran's Flag is a white cross on a black background. 
3. St Piran's Day is the national day of the people of Cornwall and is held on March 5th.
4. Traditionally only six towns mark St Piran's Day - though now other ones have joined.
5. According to legend St Piran was born in Ireland in the 6th century.
6. St Piran had miraculous powers and a group of kings grew afraid of his powers and threw him into the sea. He was washed ashore at Perranporth.
7. During the late-19th Century modern-day celebrations were started by Celtic revivalists to provide people with a national day of celebration.
8. Celebrations on St Piran's Day involve lots of merriment with many questionable festivities and gave rise to the expression "drunk as a Perraner".
9. In Grass Valley, California, St Piran's Day is also celebrated to honor the Cornish miners who helped in the mines in the mid 19th century.
10. Each year, St Piran's story is retold in a drama on the dunes in Perranporth on the Sunday nearest to March 5.

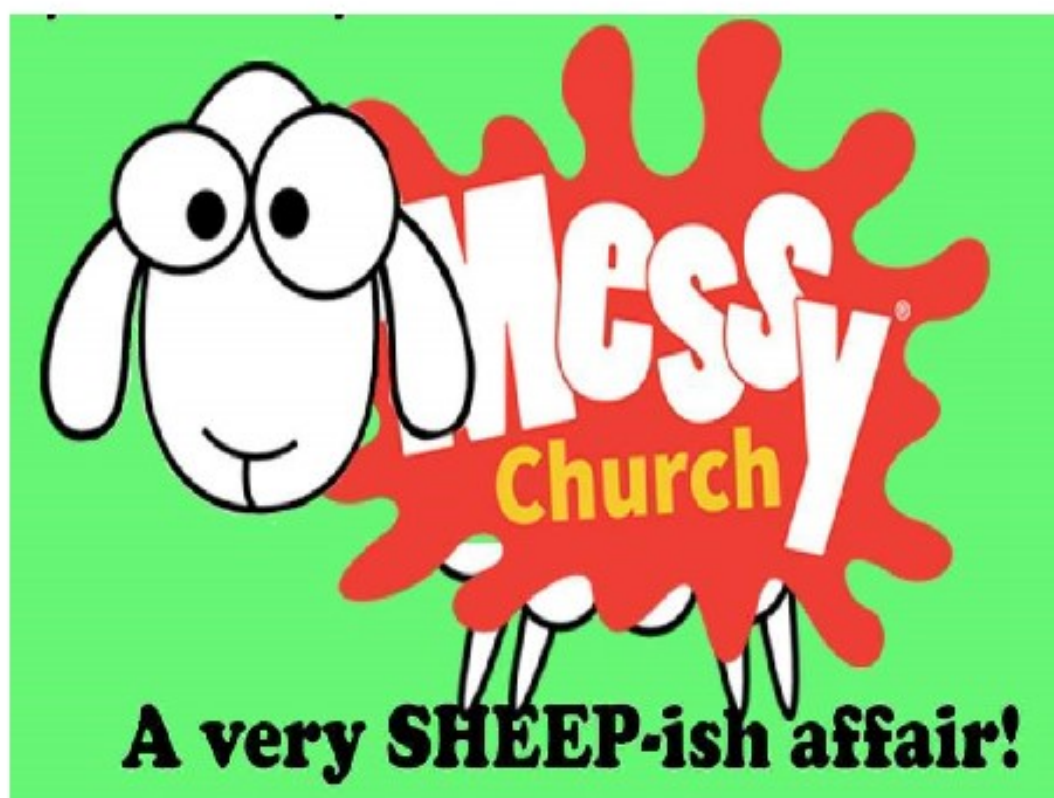
On Sunday 1st March, George and Seb took part in a Hockey tournament at Penair school, playing for Truro Green team.
