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
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#### Ladoca class trip to the **Eden Project**

## HEADLICE

We have been contacted by a number of families who are struggling to get rid of head lice infestations from their children. Please appreciate that whilst we do all we can to support parents with information and reminders of how to tackle the head lice problem, it CANNOT be the school's responsibility to overcome the problem; this has to be down to the parents. Unless <u>EVERYONE</u> is diligent in checking their child's head and treating the problem, we will not break the cycle and head lice will continue to be a problem.
